50th Anniversary

Almost 50 years ago we had some trees planted in our school grounds as part of an initiative to plant more trees across the country. Mrs Sooley Was a teaching assistant at Calverley CE Primary in 1973 and she helped to plant some of those trees.

To celebrate the 50th anniversary of the trees being planted we have invited Mrs Christine Sooley back to school where she will be helping us to plant some more trees. This tree planting event launches our ambitious Green Team work to make the most of our incredible outdoor space in school.



Scotts Pine Trees

One of the 3 types of trees we will be planting will be pine trees.

- They are an evergreen conifer – What does evergreen mean?
- They can grow up to 35m tall and live for 700 hundred years – How will this support wildlife in our local area?



Rowan Trees

Another of the 3 types of trees we will be planting will be Rowan trees.

- They produce white flowers in Spring and Summer then Red Berries in Autumn.
- They can grow up to 15 m and live for 200 years.
- Their flowers provide pollen and nectar for bees.

Why do you think this type of tree has been chosen?



Silver Birch Trees

The third and final type of tree will be a Birch Tree.

- A Birch tree can grow up to 1 meter per year and reach a height of 30m.
- They have small triangular leaves that form a light canopy – How will this help us in warmer weather? What event takes place for the school in Summer on the field?
- Birch wood is tough and heavy and often used for furniture so these trees will stand tall for many years.





On Thursday 10th some of you, including the school council, will be helping to plant the trees along the back fence of the field. If you are outside why not visit the site and have a look at the young trees.
