Provision Time

- Your child will have periods of direct adult input daily - either whole class or group depending on what is being taught.
- Your child will then spend much longer periods of time in *Continuous Provision* where the adults will be observing, supporting, challenging and teaching.
- The provision is free-flow, children can access both Reception classrooms and outside when they choose.



Provision Time

- During provision time, your child will learn through play.
- High-quality planned resources for play experiences (e.g. a role-play baby clinic) support and extend children's learning. They provide the chance to develop:
- Language opportunities
- Resilience
- Problem-solving skills
- Imagination and creativity
- Social skills
- Concentration skills
- Application of subject knowledge from adult input time, showing their understanding.






Topic

- The topics we cover in Reception are inspired by the children
- Initially we often think about ourselves, our families and celebrating ourselves as unique individuals, as children settle in.
- Then we will move on to topics that the particular cohort of children show interest in - this year we have looked at Dinosaurs and Minibeasts due to specific interests.
- This makes learning meaningful for the children. Our Topic theme has strong links to the texts we look at in Literacy, as well as the provision activities around the rooms.



Maths



- The Numberblocks characters introduce concepts of number to support early mathematical understanding.
- Acts as a springboard for us to explore key mathematical concepts and vocabulary, in lessons and the provision.

Maths


- Maths during your child's first term is very much based around them gaining a secure understanding of numbers to 5, and then 10.
- This involves:
- Composition of the numbers
- How they can be represented practically in different ways
- Demonstrating 1-1 correspondence when counting and counting out
- Number formation
- Sequencing of known numbers and the relationship between them.



Phonics

- Phonics is a method for teaching reading and writing.
- It develops phonemic awareness the ability to hear, recognise and use the sounds within words.
- Learners are also taught the correspondence between sounds and the written letters that represent them.
- We use the 'Read, Write, Inc' Phonics scheme to help children develop their phonetic awareness. This is a structured and systematic Phonics programme that we deliver to the children in small group sessions four times a week.

Phonic Parent workshop held in Autumn half term when phonic sessions begin in school.

How you can help
